

# House rules for the asylum reception centre

As a resident of the asylum reception centre, you must follow the house rules. They are there to ensure that you and the other residents have a safe and good living environment.

## 1 Peace, order and security

- There must be peace and quiet in the reception centre between the hours of 23.00 and 6.00.
- Do not act in an unpleasant way towards or disturb the other residents. Violence, vandalism and other criminal offences will be reported to the UDI and the police.
- You are not allowed to drink alcohol in the common areas.
- You are not allowed to smoke cigarettes, waterpipes ('hookahs') or electric cigarettes in the common areas or in your room.
- Pets are not allowed in the asylum reception centre.
- You must learn what to do if there is a crisis or a fire at the reception centre.

## 2 Use of rooms and equipment

- Keep the common rooms and the outdoor area tidy. Ensure that bicycles, prams and other equipment do not block the escape routes.
- Keep your room clean and tidy.
- Recycle your waste and dispose of it in the bins.
- All residents must clean the common rooms regularly. A list has been drawn up showing when it is your turn to clean, and you must clean the rooms when it is your turn.
- Use the washing machines, kitchen utensils and washing equipment as instructed in the manuals.

## 3 Overnight visits

- Any overnight visitors must be agreed with the reception centre in advance.
- The reception centre may refuse overnight visits.
- All overnight visitors must live in Norway and must show a valid ID or asylum seeker certificate to the reception centre staff.
- Please show consideration for the other residents when you have an overnight visitor.
- You are responsible for providing food and bedding for your guests.
- Adults may have overnight visits from their own children, as well as friends and family members who live in other reception centres.
- Children under the age of 18 may have overnight visits from their parents, siblings and friends of the same age as themselves.
